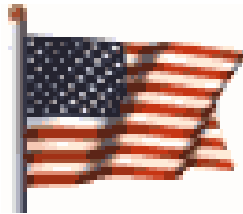

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

DO NOT BECOME COMPLACENT

- Always be aware of your surroundings-even at home and shopping!
- Identify theft continues to be a threat. Do not leave bills overnight in mailbox.
- Home Invasions are back. Use dead bolt locks.
- Car theft and vandalism is the #1 crime in our area. Always secure your vehicle doors, windows, hood and trunk.
- Put all packages and valuables out of sight including telephones and garage door opener.
- Never wear extravagant jewelry when going out alone.
- Lock both your car and inside garage door. Keep garage door closed.
- If you must park outside your garage, an alarm helps to scare thieves.
- Pay attention to all alarms.
- Keep your purse close to your body or use your pockets.
- Never attach a tag with your name and address to a key ring.

- Teach your children not to open any door to strangers.
- Avoid planting large shrubs that can hide intruders near your doors or windows.

When parking:

- Park in well lit areas (under lights, as close to the building as possible).
- Do not place packages in car, then leave.
- Leave malls with a friend/have someone walk out with you if it is dark.
- Do not enter or leave your vehicle if you spot someone suspicious.
- Stay away from large bushes or dark places that could hide someone.

When driving:

- Watch to see if anyone is following you home.
- At a stop light/sign leave enough space between you and the car in front of you to maneuver out if necessary.
- Have a map and flashlight (with fresh batteries) in the car for emergencies.
- Keep Your cell phone charged.
