NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH **COORDINATOR MEETING**

The City of Elk Grove Police Department Neighborhood Watch Coordinators Quarterly meeting was held Wednesday, January 21, 2007. Denise Costello, Crime Prevention Specialist conducted the meeting. Denise discussed the Citizens Academy class offered to NW Coordinators. This is a fourteen week evening program designed to inform and teach interested citizens the various aspects of municipal policing. The Citizens Academy is an active learning experience that includes "hands on" with the Forensic Technicians in gathering evidence, observing K-9 Officers and their four legged partners in action and "riding along". The goal of the Citizens Academy is to enhance the relationship between the Elk Grove Police Department and the citizens, resulting in a clearer understanding of what the community can expect form the police employees who serve them and what services can be provided. Michael was accepted in the first class and started 2/27/07. Officer Scott Williams. Forensic Technician discussed burglaries and various teams e.g. Coroner, CSI Investigator, Forensic Science Technicians that work together on a crime to investigate and solve. Crime Prevention - Be more watchful what you put inside your cars. Also, be watchful to your neighbor. Get an alarm system and use your CA driver license number to mark your valuables.
