ICE stands for "In Case of Emergency". If you add an entry in the contacts list in your cell phone under ICE, emergency services will know who to call. Save a lot of time and have your loved ones contacted quickly. Under ICE list your emergency contact. Paramedics know what ICE means and they look for it immediately. ICE your cell phone NOW!

WATER CONSERVATION

This is a reminder from the Sacramento County Water Agency. Residential and commercial locations bearing a street address ending in an **odd number** are permitted to water

only on **Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday**, and locations bearing a street address ending in an **even number** are permitted to water only on **Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday**. No watering is permitted on Mondays.

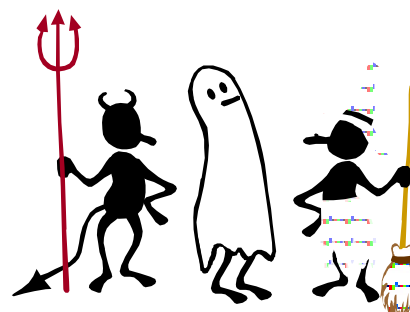
