CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

DO NOT BECOME COMPLACENT

- Always be aware of your surroundings-even at home and shopping! Watch for suspicious acting people.

-Identify theft continues to be a threat. Do not leave checks for bills overnight in any outside mailbox. Shred any personal information. Be aware of new technology that can scan your credit card numbers from your wallet, purse or pockets.

-Car theft and vandalism is a consistent crime in our area.

Always secure your vehicle doors, windows, hood and trunk.

-Put all packages and valuables out of sight including telephones, backpacks, brief cases and garage door opener.

-Never wear extravagant jewelry when going out alone. Gold chains are easy to pull off your neck.

-Lock both your car and inside garage door. Keep garage door closed.

-If you must park outside your garage, an alarm helps to scare thieves.

-Pay attention to all alarms.

-Keep your purse close to

your body or use your pockets.

-Never attach a tag with your name and address to a key ring.

-Teach your children not to open any door to strangers or place personal information on social media.

-Only use secured websites.
